The Center for Fiction is looking for current MLIS students for a summer internship beginning mid-May, or fall internship beginning September. This is an unpaid position but can be taken for school credit.

Interns will help maintain the Center's 85,000-volume library and independent bookstore, gain experience in original and copy cataloging of materials, circulation, weeding, reader's advisory, and work with our nineteenth-century collection. Interns will also help with our roster of readings and events. This internship requires a minimum commitment of two five-hour shifts per week. All interns will receive a free year's membership to the Center for Fiction (a value of \$120), which includes borrowing privileges and discounts on classes and book purchases.
